THE BRENDAN KENNELLY MEMORIAL LECTURE:

WINDING THE CLOCK: THE O'RAHILLY & THE IRISH REVOLUTION

Ballylongford native Michael Joseph O'Rahilly (1875 - 1916), known as The O'Rahilly was a founding member of the Irish Volunteers in 1913 and served as Director of Arms. Despite opposing the action, he took part in the Easter Rising in Dublin and was killed in a charge on a British machine gun post covering the retreat from the Dublin GPO during the fighting. In this lecture Eunan O'Halpin, Emeritus Professor of Contemporary Irish History at Trinity College Dublin will explore The O'Rahilly's role in the Irish Revolution on the 150th year of his birth. *In association with NEWKD*.
